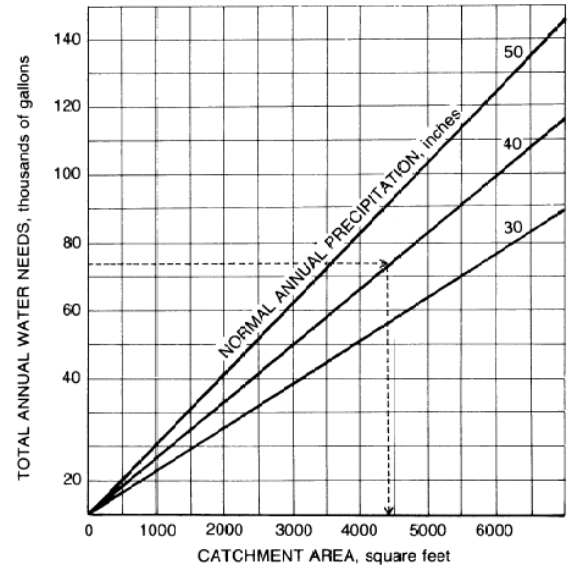

Come join Clair Klock, a blueberry farmer and senior conservation specialist, to explore the costs and benefits of utilizing rainwater harvesting systems. Claire will discuss the pros and cons of different systems and their benefits; above and below ground tank installation will be addressed and case studies to explore development of systems ranging from 50 gallon rain barrels to 20,000 gallon steel tanks and 2 million gallon ponds.
